Associate in Applied Science – Dental Hygiene

The curriculum is designed to prepare selected students to serve in a dynamic and growing health profession as valuable members of the Dental Health team. At the successful completion of the program, the student will be eligible to take the National Board and Regional Board Examinations in Dental Hygiene leading to licensure as a Registered Dental Hygienist (R.D.H.). 64 credit hours are required for completion (72 with 8-credit NAS prerequisite).
