

Virginia Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program

What is Women, Infants and Children (WIC)?

WIC helps low- and moderate-income women who are pregnant or breastfeeding, or have children up to 5 years old, get the food they need.

How does it work?

WIC participants receive monthly checks or “food instruments” to buy specific foods to improve their diets. Some WIC State agencies give out WIC foods through warehouses or deliver WIC foods. WIC also provides health screenings and medical referrals. The food assistance does not provide all nutritional needs, and aid is based on a woman’s stage of pregnancy and/or the ages of her children.
