

DC Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

What is the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)?

LIHEAP helps elderly and low- and moderate-income households meet their cooling and heating energy needs.

How does it work?

LIHEAP provides:

- Bill payment assistance (1 payment per year)
- Energy crisis assistance for households which have received an electricity or gas service disconnection notice or are already disconnected
- Weatherization and similar home repairs

The amount of assistance is based on household size, household income, energy source, and type of home. Coverage usually ranges from \$49-\$1,300, with the average award being approximately \$400.

To receive help, applicants need to show income from employment and assistance, along with copies of utility bills or a Final Utility Termination Notice.
