

Fairfax Accessible Medication

What is the Fairfax Accessible Medication Program?

Most pharmaceutical companies offer free prescription medication to those with low incomes who either have no health insurance or have health insurance which does not cover prescriptions. The Fairfax Accessible Medication Program provides a case worker who helps people complete applications for such medications. Help is available to those who are:

- Living in Fairfax County, the City of Fairfax or the City of Falls Church
- Currently taking medication for a chronic illness -- such as, but not limited to, diabetes, high blood pressure, and heart disease. You must have a physician who is prescribing the medication for a chronic illness.
- Not covered by health insurance or prescription coverage. Medicare recipients are eligible. If you currently have a Medicare prescription assistance card, you are still eligible for this program.
- Within income eligibility limits set by the pharmaceutical companies. If you are married, your and your spouse's incomes are considered. Children's income is not counted. Income includes social security, pension, retirement, and wages.
 - Single person: \$1,805 per month
 - Family of 2 (married couple): \$2,428 per month

How does it work?

All medication is ordered from the producing pharmaceutical companies. The program is free. The medications will be delivered to your physician or to you in 30 to 45 days.
