

Medical Care for Children Partnership (MCCP)

What is the Medical Care for Children Partnership (MCCP)?

The Medical Care for Children Partnership provides medical and dental services to children in low- and moderate-income families who are not able to receive health care through Medicaid or other sources. Physicians, dentists, pharmacies and labs who are part of the program provide services at reduced costs, and the Fairfax County government covers all administrative costs.

How does it work?

MCCP serves children up to 18 years of age. Children's' parents or caretakers can earn up to 250% of the federal poverty level (for example, \$55,125 for a family of four).

Note: If your income is less than 200% of the federal poverty level and you are a citizen or qualified alien, your child may instead qualify for [FAMIS](#), Virginia's children's health insurance program.
