

MD Primary Adult Care Program (PAC)

What is PAC?

Persons who are not Medicare beneficiaries or not eligible for Medicaid benefits may qualify for Maryland's Primary Adult Care Program (PAC). This program assists low-income people, age 19 to 64, with paying for pharmacy programs covered under the Medical Assistance Program.

How does it work?

Upon determining eligibility, you will have to choose a Managed Care Organization (MCO) and a primary care provider under that MCO. Services covered under PAC include:

- ▣ Pharmacy prescriptions with a co-payment of \$2.50 for generic drugs and \$7.50 for brand name drugs
- ▣ Free primary health care
- ▣ Free in-office mental health services
- ▣ Limited lab and diagnostic services
- ▣ Outpatient substance abuse services

Income Limits

Your income must be below 116% of the Federal Poverty Level. For one person, this is about \$12,563. For two people, this is about \$16,901.
